DAY 1 • Tokyo, Japan

There are as many Tokyos to discover as there are interests. Cuisine? It has more Michelin stars than any other city. Culture? Kabuki theater and sumo wrestling are just the beginning. Shopping? The posh boutiques of Ginza lie on one end of the spectrum, workshops that hand-craft samurai swords at the other.

DAY 2 • Shimizu, Japan

Frame the perfect portrait of Mount Fuji from a hundred perfect angles, or just savor its symmetry sans lens. Either way, consider your day here well spent.

DAY 3 • Shingu, Japan

Pilgrims have been climbing the Kii Mountain Range for a thousand years, but few visitors to Japan even know about the trio of sacred shrines that compose this UNESCO World Heritage Site. The most striking, Kumanonachi Taisha, includes a fiery orange pagoda posing next to Nachi Falls, the tallest waterfall in Japan. Don't fail to turn around and look back down the often mist-shrouded valley.

DAY 4 • At Sea

This is your time to sleep late and enjoy a luxurious spa treatment.

DAY 5 • Kagoshima, Japan

This castle town with its signature Sakurajima volcano dates to the 14th century. Time-travel back to the days of the samurai in Chiran's picturesque samurai district, its views unsullied by telephone poles or parked cars. Go "sand bathing" in the naturally heated sands of Ibusuki.

DAY 6 • Scenic Cruising Hashima Island/ Nagasaki, Japan

Explore World War II's legacy in the Atomic Bomb Museum and Peace Memorial Park, or discover the historic Dutch trading post on Dejima Island where Japan attempted to keep its finger in the dike of western influence.

DAY 7 • Busan, South Korea

Hot springs, 1,500-year-old Tongdosa Temple, and the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Gyeongju — once the capital of the Shila Kingdom — are just a few highlights of South Korea's second-largest city. For something different, visit Gamcheon Culture Village where terraced homes pour over the slopes like a rainbow-hued waterfall.

DAY 8 • Karatsu, Japan

Karatsu is about as close as Japan gets to the Korean Peninsula, and it was a potter from Korea who introduced the city to its now-famous ceramics industry. The pottery is sturdy, solid, often in muted earth



tones inspired by the natural beauty all around. Cherry trees and wisteria bloom around graceful white Karatsu Castle. Niji no Matsubara, a road skirting Karatsu Bay, tunnels through arching pine trees planted as a seawall in the Edo Period. Waterfalls drape the hillsides south of town.

DAY 9 • Hiroshima, Japan

Fold a paper crane to leave at the Atomic Dome, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and visit Hiroshima Castle to see three trees that survived the bombing that destroyed the castle itself. Or head to Miyajima, one of the most scenic spots in Japan, for a look at the vermillion Itsukushima Shrine floating in the sea — yet another World Heritage Site.

DAY 10 • Takamatsu, Japan

Every visit to Takamatsu must include at least two things: Dining on udon noodles and Ritsurin Garden. It took 120 years to create Ritsurin Garden, an Edo-period strolling garden of ponds, bridges, artificial hills, and pavilions, with Mount Shiun thoughtfully placed in the background. Even without knowing it's earned three Michelin stars you can't help but be impressed, especially right now when the park's cherry trees are in bloom. Take a wasen boat across the main pond and savor views once reserved for feudal lords.

DAY 11 • Osaka, Japan

Go ashore with an included stop at Osaka Castle, the largest castle in Japan during the golden age of the samurai with a rollercoaster history involving war, lightning, typhoons, and even destruction by the castle's own troops. Two of Nara's UNESCO sites are up next: the stunning Kasuga Taisha Shrine, its 3,000 lanterns guiding the way to enlightenment, and Todaiji Temple where the world's largest wooden building houses the world's largest bronze Buddha. Spend the night at the Kyoto Hotel Okura.

DAY 12 • Kyoto, Japan

Two more UNESCO World Heritage Sites are included today. Kinkaku-ji (the Golden Pavilion) shines even on an overcast day with its gold leaf exterior. This symbol of Kyoto has burned down many times over the years, each time rising from the ashes to glow again in Kyoko-chi Pond. Back in Japan's feudal era, nearby Nijo Castle housed the visiting shogun, protected by an ancient security system known as "nightingale floors" that squeak if intruders approach. End the day at a local machiya (townhouse) in Kyoto where you can try on a kimono as you learn their history and attend a traditional tea ceremony.

DAY 13 • Kyoto, Japan

Spend your last morning in Japan sleeping in, shopping your hotel's underground mall for last-minute souvenirs, or enjoying a leisurely traditional Japanese breakfast before transferring to the airport for your flight home.





Day 1 • Fairbanks

Rivers, mountains, emerald wilderness, and milky blue glacial lakes pass below during the flight to Fairbanks. After meeting your Alaskan Guide and transferring to your comfortable hotel, the rest of the day is yours to rest up or explore downtown Fairbanks' unique blend of old and new.

Day 2 • Fairbanks to Denali National Park

Board the *Riverboat Discovery* for a trip back in time on the Chena River, stopping along the way to learn frontier living skills at an Athabascan Indian village, watch an Alaskan bush pilot use the river as a runway, and visit Iditarod champion Susan Butcher's kennels. After a scenic drive to Denali National Park, get a taste of old-time Alaska at Alaska Cabin Nite Dinner Theater, complete with an all-you-can-eat salmon and barbecue ribs dinner.

Day 3 • Full Day at Denali National Park

Day 4 • Denali National Park to Talkeetna

Day 5 • Talkeetna to Anchorage to Seward

Day 8 • Sitka, Alaska

This humble port city was once the capital of Russian America. In fact, back when San Francisco had fewer than ten residents, Sitka was a boomtown of 800. Explore the Russian and Tlingit cultures that influenced its growth and capture an iconic photo of the Russian Orthodox Church, or head to the Alaska Raptor Center for a close-up look at bald eagles and other birds of prey.

Day 9 • Scenic Cruising Inian Islands/ Icy Strait Point, Alaska (On 16-day cruise tour only)

Alaska's largest Hoonah Tlingit village is just down the road. Or discover the island's other superlatives — Point Adolphus is home to Alaska's largest summer population of humpback whales, and the nearby Spasski River Valley is famous for having one of the highest densities of coastal grizzlies in the world.

Day 10 • Haines, Alaska

This quaint little town on North America's longest fjord borders 20 million acres of protected wilderness. Outdoor adventures are obviously high on the list here, from kayak and raft trips to photo safaris. But you can also pass a very pleasant day just strolling the streets, meeting the locals, and browsing shops filled with Native Tlingit arts and crafts.

Day 11 • Juneau, Alaska

Alaska's isolated capital city hugs the shore of Gastineau Channel with breathtaking scenery and glaciers all around. Of the 30-some glaciers in the Juneau Ice Field, only one — Taku Glacier — is still advancing. Fly over it in a helicopter, then land to peer down into a crevasse and taste the purity of glacial streams.

Day 12 • Scenic Cruising Tracy Arm/ Endicott Arm, Alaska

Today you'll have the opportunity to see tidewater glaciers up close and personal on a Zodiac tour, a kayak expedition, or cruising in the comfort of *Star Breeze*. At Tracy Arm we follow the ice to its source up the 30-mile-long fjord to twin Sawyer Glaciers to watch enormous slabs of ice calve off the glacier's face. When ice makes the route impassable, we cruise the wider Endicott Arm to Dawes Glacier.

Day 13 • Wrangell, Alaska

Bears, petroglyphs, and totem poles just scratch the surface of Wrangell's attractions. Hike to Rainbow Falls, go fishing, or visit the local museum to learn about the town's unique claim to fame as the only Alaskan city to have existed under four nations — the Stikine Tlingits, Russia, Great Britain, and the United States.

Day 14 • Scenic Cruising Misty Fjords, Alaska

Cruise past all the big ships' shore excursion boats in the comfort of the intimate and nimble *Star Breeze*. Enjoy a drink, a bite, or stretch out in your suite. You'll know this is definitely the way to see Misty Fjords. Want to power your very own vessel to see the sights? Take a kayak trek for the paddle of a lifetime.

Day 15 • Ketchikan, Alaska

The waterway hums with float planes, and boardwalks, colorful stilted buildings, and a profusion of steep wooden staircases inviting you to explore. The town stretches 31 miles along the coast but is never more than 10 blocks wide, squeezed to the shore by the steep hillsides. You'll find plenty to do within just a few minutes of the pier, from Dolly's House Museum in a former bordello on Creek Street to Saxman Native Village with its totem poles and native dances.

Day 16 • Scenic Cruising Canadian Inside Passage

There's a reason this region is so popular with yachtsmen. You could spend years exploring this archipelago and never discover all the hidden coves, secluded villages, and magnificent landscapes. Sunset is a special time as the light turns the passage red and silver.

Day 17 • Vancouver, BC, Canada

The city that began as a frontier fur trading post is now a bustling metropolis with an almost unfair boon of jawdropping natural beauty and thriving culture. Take it all in on your way to Canada Place Cruise Terminal.

Day 1 • Fairbanks

You're in the heart of Alaska now, just 198 miles from the Arctic Circle. Meet your Alaskan Guide at the airport and check in to your hotel. If you're still feeling energetic, stretch your legs along the scenic Chena River Walk or take a self-guided tour of the historic downtown.

Day 2 • Fairbanks to Denali National Park

Alaska's frontier past comes to life during your three-hour *Riverboat Discovery* cruise as you explore an Athabascan village and meet hardworking sled dogs at an Iditarod kennel. Discover a bit of luxury in the wilderness when you reach Denali National Park, sipping cocktails at a Welcome Reception and dining on all-you-can-eat salmon and barbecue ribs. A live show at Alaska Cabin Nite Dinner Theater rounds out the evening.

Day 3 • Full Day at Denali National Park

You're booked on the most coveted wildlife tour in Denali — the sevento eight-hour Tundra Wilderness Tour. Keep an eye out for Alaska's Big Five wildlife, from gawky moose and caribou to death-defying Dall sheep, elusive wolves, and grizzly bears. Return to the lodge with enough daylight left for an optional adventure.

Day 4 • Denali National Park to Talkeetna

Enjoy the perfect perch for observing Alaskan scenery as you ride a deluxe domed train from Denali to Talkeetna, the town that inspired "Northern Exposure." Upon arrival, a local speaker fills you in on the town's colorful past before you adjourn to the Farewell Dinner.

Day 5 • Talkeetna to Anchorage to Seward

Three thrills are on the docket for today: a breathtaking motor coach journey from Talkeetna to Seward, a stop at the Anchorage Museum with its fascinating blend of Russian, Native, gold rush, and pioneer history, and the pièce de résistance, the lovely *Star Breeze*.

Day 6 • Scenic Cruising College Fjord, Alaska

Welcome to College Fjord, boasting the largest collection of tidewater glaciers in the world as well as several valley glaciers. Unlike Glacier Bay the trees here are well established, adding a sense of scale that makes the massive rivers of ice even more impressive.

Day 7 • Valdez, Alaska

This small town (population 4,000) is for small ships only, and odds are good that no one you know has been here. The area is known for its cascading waterfalls fed by Thompson Pass, the "snowiest place in Alaska," but there's plenty else to make the day pass quickly. Browse the quirky shops and restaurants along North Harbor Drive, explore the town's two noteworthy museums, or relax as you watch the multitude of fishing boats bobbing in the harbor.

Day 8 • Scenic Cruising Hubbard Glacier, Alaska

Hubbard Glacier is the largest tidewater glacier in North America, and while most of Alaska's glaciers are retreating, Hubbard has been thickening and advancing since mapping began in 1895. This means you have a good chance of seeing the glacier calve, dropping icebergs up to three or four stories in height into the sea.

Day 9 • Scenic Cruising Point Adolphus/ Icy Strait Point (Hoonah), Alaska

Every summer humpback whales make the 3,000-mile journey from Hawaii to Alaska to feast on krill and schooling fish, and one of the very best places to see them is off Point Adolphus. Humpbacks aren't the only mammals attracted to these nutrient-rich waters, either. On an excursion from Icy Strait Point you can search for Alaskan coastal brown bears — the Spasski River valley is famous for having one of the highest densities of coastal brown bears in the world.

Day 10 • Juneau, Alaska

Tiny Juneau is only reachable by air or sea — an odd circumstance for a state capital. But oh, what scenery! Whether you go whale watching in Gastineau Channel or soar over the Boundary Range and its glaciers by helicopter, there's no "wrong" way to spend your day.

Day 11 • Scenic Cruising Tracy Arm/Endicott Arm, Alaska

Like a trail of bread crumbs we follow ice debris up Tracy Arm, a 30-mile-long fjord that terminates at the twin Sawyer Glaciers. If weather and ice conditions permit, we reach the terminus and watch an unforgettable show as enormous slabs of ice calve off the glacier's face. If ice blocks our way, we'll cruise the broader Endicott Arm where Dawes Glacier awaits.

Day 12 • Petersburg, Alaska

Alaska's Little Norway was founded more than 100 years ago by Norwegian fishermen, and while it's still a fishing town today, it's a fishing town with a difference. The town still has a strong Norwegian identity and is surprisingly passionate about the arts. Walls are decorated with murals, sidewalks have decorative brass inlays, and traditional Norwegian rosemaling adorns windows, doors, and shutters.

Day 13 • Wrangell, Alaska

An impressive collection of totem poles highlights the town and Chief Shakes Island — well worth the short walk over a foot bridge. Stroll up to Petroglyph Beach State Historic Park to see thousandyear-old rock carvings, or earn your bear badge at the Anan Wildlife Observatory where viewing platforms let you watch bears chow down on spawning salmon.

Day 14 • Prince Rupert, BC, Canada/ Scenic Cruising Grenville Channel

Take a tour of the old salmon cannery – a mini-city in itself – or shop the heritage buildings of Cow Bay, named back when cattle had to swim from barge to shore. Afterwards, navigate the narrow, scenic Grenville Channel – a passage seldom traveled by larger cruise ships . Mountains loom above the forest and in places the channel is only a quarter-mile wide, giving you a great view of either shoreline.

Day 15 • Scenic Cruising Canadian Inside Passage

Dense spruce forests and a labyrinth of hump-backed islands seem to merge and part magically as we round each bend. Aside from the beauty of the scenery, it's entertaining to watch as life goes on – fishing boats fish, sailboats sail, orcas make the occasional appearance as they hunt for their dinner. Yours will be served hot with fine wine and good company.

Day 16 • Vancouver, BC, Canada

Arrive in Vancouver a changed person after your voyage through the Alaskan wilderness. Bid farewell to your traveling companions and the crew of *Star Breeze*, then turn your attention to exploring this fair city in the time you have remaining.

Wrangell, Alaska



DAY 1 • Seward (Anchorage), Alaska

Nestled between the rugged peaks of the Chugach Range and the picturesque waters of Cook Inlet, Anchorage is Alaska's Big City in the heart of the wilderness. Arrive early and whet your appetite for the journey ahead with visits to the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center and Alaska Native Heritage Center, or simply enjoy the drive south along the spectacular Seward Highway to where your ship awaits.

DAY 2 • Scenic Cruising Kenai Fjords National Park, Alaska

One of Alaska's most popular attractions, Kenai Fjords will take your breath away. Most cruise guests must leave their ship behind and board a smaller excursion boat to take in the scenery, but not you. You cruise past it all surrounded by the comforts of your ship, sipping cocoa on deck or relaxing by the windows in the lounge.

DAY 3 • At Sea

DAY 4 • Sitka, Alaska

You can't miss the copper-domed St. Michael's Cathedral, one of 22 historic buildings that tell of Sitka's fascinating past. This was once the capital of Russian America and is where "Seward's Folly" – the purchase of Alaska from Russia - officially took place in 1867. Looking around at the colorful harbor and brace of mountain peaks behind, it's hard to imagine how the Russians could have given up such priceless property for such a pittance.

DAY 5 • Scenic Cruising Inian Islands/ Icy Strait Point (Hoonah), Alaska (On 12-day cruise only)

Welcome to Chichagof Island, an Eden waiting to be explored. Alaska's

largest Hoonah Tlingit village is just down the road. Or discover the island's other superlatives - Point Adolphus is home to Alaska's largest summer population of humpback whales, and the nearby Spasski River Valley is famous for having one of the highest densities of coastal grizzlies in the world.

DAY 6 • Haines, Alaska

White-headed bald eagles, brown bears, pink salmon, spring wildflowers ... there's no end to photo-worthy subjects in the Chilkat Valley. Bring your camera — any camera — and catch your limit. Or opt for a dab of history and explore Fort William H. Seward, last of Alaska's gold rushera military outposts.

DAY 7 • Juneau, Alaska

Alaska's state capital does have roads, but if you plan to leave the city, it will have to be by air or water. One look at the 4,000-foot, glacierdraped peaks that nearly abut the city explains why. And who would want to leave? Residents are blasé about the whales that cavort in Gastineau Channel, the glacier and rainforest in their own backyard, the "catch of the day" that really is. You, on the other hand, are free to be astounded.

DAY 8 • Scenic Cruising Tracy Arm/Endicott Arm, Alaska

As we make our way up stunning Tracy Arm Fjord, ice debris makes its way down, as if a giant icemaker was churning away at fjord's end. And in a way, there is. The twin Sawyer Glaciers are famous for calving copious amounts of ice from cube size to cabin size, glittering in the scenic fjord like diamonds.

DAY 9 • Wrangell, Alaska

Fishermen can try their luck for enormous halibut and salmon, or enjoy some of the finest fly fishing in the world. There are outdoor activities galore, but for many the highlight is the Anan Creek Bear Observatory where wild black and brown bears fish for salmon as bald eagles (and you) watch.

DAY 10 • Scenic Cruising Misty Fjords, Alaska

Rock walls shoot straight up from the sea, waterfalls tumble down slopes covered in lush vegetation, and your ship glides through mirrored reflections of the snowcapped peaks. Each bend of the fjord yields epic views as you penetrate the heart of Alaska's wilderness few other cruise lines visit.

DAY 11 • Ketchikan, Alaska

Take a walk down historic Creek Street - actually a wooden boardwalk - past former bordellos and above swirling salmon. Smell the fresh tang of cedar as Tlingit, Tsimshian, and Haida artists carve totem poles and weave bark baskets at Saxman Native Village or kayak around Eagle Island with wildlife on all sides.

DAY 12 • Scenic Cruising Canadian Inside Passage

Even prospectors on their way north to the Klondike must have paused to appreciate the beauty of this passage. The sheltering archipelago unfolds in layers of deep forest green on a sea the color of kelp and oyster.

DAY 13 • Vancouver, BC, Canada

Pass beneath the beautiful Lions Gate suspension bridge on the way to Canada Place Cruise Terminal. The bridge clearance restricts some large cruise ships from making the passage but we glide right through and into this sparkling city. It's well worth extending your stay to take in all the attractions of Stanley Park, the Vancouver Aquarium, Gastown, Chinatown, and Granville Island's Public Market.

Drive through thick rainforest to Blue Osa Retreat, a sliver of civilization sandwiched between Corcovado National Park and Golfo Dulce. Upon arrival

style Creole instead of Spanish, reggae spills from the bars, and the vibe is distinctly laid-back Caribbean. You can even get your hair braided on the beach. Small and hard to reach, it's escaped the development and crowds of other islands, offering the few guests who do come here uncrowded beaches, great snorkeling, and something every Caribbean island needs — tales of hidden treasure buried in a cave by pirate Henry Morgan.

Day 1 • Colón, Panama

Untouched beaches, lowland rainforests, and elaborate colonial architecture lie just beyond the commercial center of Colón. There are plenty of things here to satisfy virtually every interest — sunbathing on gold-sand beaches, exploring ancient ruins, or admiring the massive locks on the other side of the formidable Panama Canal.

Day 2 • Transit Panama Canal, Panama

At nearly 51 miles long and connecting two oceans with a vast "highway of water," the Panama Canal easily earns its reputation as the Eighth Wonder of the World. Experience a once-in-a-lifetime thrill as your ship is raised, then lowered 85 feet to cruise gracefully through three massive locks that transport you between the shimmering waters of the Atlantic and the calm Pacific Ocean.

Day 3 • Fuerte Amador (Panama City), Panama

A short drive takes you to Casco Viejo, the historic district of Panama City, now a World Heritage Site. Follow the cobblestone lanes past restored colonial buildings to the old sea wall, where you can shop for colorful molas hand-stitched by Guna Indians.

Day 4 • At Sea

Cruise alongside chattering dolphins and peaceful island shorelines as you ply the shimmering waters of Panama. Before you stretches a full day to do exactly as you please. Submit to the temptation of a relaxing massage in the Spa, check out the books and DVD selection in the cozy Library, or get to know your fellow travelers in the lively Pool Bar or Lounge.

Day 5 • Isla Parida, Panama

The perfect spot to host Windstar's Signature Beach Party ... crystal clear waters that remain at 82° F, fresh mangos and coconuts on whitesand beaches. What more could you ask for?

Day 6 • Puerto Jimenez (Golfo Dulce), Costa Rica

Along the way you learn about the wildlife you might encounter at the Monteverde Reserve. Founded in 1972, the Monteverde Cloud Forest Biological Reserve is among the most famous reserves in the world for its biodiversity, conservation, contributions, and scientific research. Hike in the forest canopy, go birding, hoping to spot the Resplendent Quetzal, or discover the aromas and beauty of the coffee plantation. The evening brings Curi-Cancha Reserve, part of a 210-acre private wildlife reserve in the very heart of Monteverde, covering both lower, and wet montane, and premontane wet virgin cloud forest. The night allows for possible sightings of mammals and sleeping birds. Enjoy the nightly symphony of frogs and insects as the cloud forest comes alive. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 9 • Monteverde to Arenal

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel to fuel you for your lake crossing to Arenal. On the way, stop at Rancho Heliconia for a tour of this world-famous Costa Rican coffee plantation, take a cooking class on local cuisine, and leave your green footprint by planting a tree. Lunch is served at Rancho Heliconia. Then head to Arenal Lake to board a boat. At the other side of the lake, head to Tabacon Resort for the rest of the evening at your leisure. Soak in the hotel's well-known hot springs to prepare for your next full day. Buffet-style dinner at Aves del Paraiso is sure to satiate you after a day of trekking.

Day 10 • Arenal

Today includes the option of ziplining through the trees or walking a series of impressive bridges in the treetops. Start your day with breakfast at your hotel. Then it's off on adventure. If you're ziplining you'll head to Arenal Park for a 20-minute gondola ride to see the rainforest, the Arenal Volcano and Arenal Lake. Then you'll zipline, traveling 600 feet in the air to see nature from a truly different perspective. Or if you're walking the bridges, you'll start your adventure at Mistico Park. You'll want to bring your binoculars to look for the birds and howler monkeys in the trees around you. Then on to Arenal Park to take the gondola ride. Enjoy lunch at the park before transferring back to your hotel for an afternoon at your leisure. Your guide will recommend some optional activities before dinner at the hotel's main restaurant Los Tucanes.

Day 11 • Arenal to San José, Costa Rica

Breakfast at the hotel. Drive back to San José for your city tour with lunch downtown. Visit the National Theater, an icon for Costa Rican people and an architectural jewel representing the progress and the fruits of the labors of their ancestors. Continue on an easy walk to Democracy Square then to the National Park featuring the bronze National Monument of Costa Rica. You will be transferred back to the Costa Rica Marriott for dinner at the hotel on your own.

Day 12 • Departure from San José

Breakfast is included at the hotel. Then private transfer will be provided to Juan Santamaria airport.



(He remembers falling for a certain young girl there as well, but that's for another story.) The captain also raves about Costa Rica's rainforest with "all the sights and sounds of its animals and birds — and lots of lizards!"

Cartagena's Old Town, a UNEŠCO World Heritage Site, is another favorite of Captain Neil, who says the colonial gem is "absolutely

amazing. The wood carvings inside Santa Domingo Cathedral are incredible, and a walk along the city walls makes for great exercise." Just beyond pastel-painted Oranjestad you'll find the monolithic Ayo Rock Formations, considered sacred by Aruba's ancient Arawak Índians; while a day in Santa Marta, Colombia's oldest city, leads to glittering displays in the Gold Museum and two UNESCO Biosphere Reserves. A final overnight in Colón allows time to explore Panama City's revitalized Old Quarter and the UNESCO-designated Fort San Lorenzo. Add a healthy dose of vitamin D from the tropical sun and, says Captain Neil, "this cruise is the perfect antidote to winter."








MEET CAPTAIN NEIL: CAPTAIN NEIL **BROOMHALL. MSc AFNI** Fleet Captain

LATE BOOKING POLICY: On bookings within 45 days of departure, Windstar Cruises requires final payment (cashier's check, electronic transfer of funds, or American Express®, Discover Card®, Visa®, or MasterCard®) before we can initiate the process of requesting hotel and/or air space; on bookings within 14 days of departure, we are unable to make air or hotel transfers or arrangements. Windstar Cruises will advise you of the status of the request within five (5) working days of receipt of final payment. If your request is confirmed, electronic tickets will be sent via email. If we are unable to confirm your late booking all monies paid will be refunded in full. Please note, changes or additions to the cruise package (i.e. transfers, special services, gifts, or onboard packages) cannot be made within seven (7) days of departure and should be arranged once you are on board the yacht.

CANCELLATION POLICY: Each cruise booking cancelled before 120 days prior to initial departure will be subject to a \$50 per person cancellation fee. A full refund (except for the amounts paid for air transportation, Cancellation Protection Plan and the \$50 per person fee) will be made for written cancellations received by Windstar Cruises at least 121 days prior to the date on which you are to commence travel by any mode of transportation booked through Windstar Cruises (air, sea, or land). Guests who cancel after that date for any reason, including medical or family reasons, are subject to the following cancellation fee schedule:

120-90 days before commencing travel – 15% of gross fare;
89-60 days before commencing travel – 35% of gross fare;
59-30 days before commencing travel – 50% of gross fare;
29-0 days before commencing travel – 100% of gross fare.

Given that the resale of cancelled space will likely result in a lost opportunity to sell other space, these fees are due regardless of resale. Windstar Cruises can only be responsible for refunding amounts actually received. Travel agencies may impose their own cancellation fees. Agency fees of any nature are a matter to be decided on solely by the agency and its customers. Windstar Cruises cruise tickets and Passage Contracts are non-transferable. Name changes and departure date changes are considered reservation cancellations/re-bookings and are subject to cancellation fees. Changes require the prior approval of Windstar Cruises and may not always be possible. Windstar Cruises cruise and accommodations cancellation policies do not apply to airline reservations. Airline reservations changes require the prior approval of airlines and may result in change fees or may not be possible.

CHANGE FEES: Changing your itinerary after reservations have been made can result in a loss of advantages gained by early planning. To cover administrative costs, a minimum charge of \$50 per person will be assessed if you request a change in your travel arrangements less than 121 days prior to commencement of travel. This doesn't apply to departure date changes made by Windstar Cruises. Change fees are not assessed for stateroom upgrades or for the addition of services unless air reservations are altered and/or travel documents must be reissued.

ADDITIONAL DEFINITIONS: "Yacht" or "Ship" refers to the vessel that will provide the ocean transportation portion of the cruise. "Cruise" refers to the specific cruise purchased by you, and shall include periods during which you are embarking or disembarking the Yacht or are on shore while the Yacht is in port. "Initial Departure" means the time at which you first begin transit by any means of transport booked by us (including air transportation) for the purpose of taking the Cruise. "Windstar Air Package" refers to air transportation booked for you by Windstar Cruises to enable you to travel to and from your Cruise. "Windstar Land Package" includes any shore activity before or after the Cruise or ashore during the Cruise arranged for you by us in connection with your Cruise.

PROHIBITED ITEMS; DRUG & ALCOHOL RESTRICTIONS; BAGGAGE:

The following are strictly prohibited on the Ship and during all aspects of the Cruise, Windstar Land Package and shore excursions: radioactive materials, recreational and medicinal marijuana and other controlled substances under USA law (see United States DEA Drug Schedules at www.dea.gov/druginfo/ ds.shtml) or any under any foreign jurisdiction the Ship enters (except lawfully obtained and transported prescription drugs other than marijuana), firearms, ammunition, weapons, fireworks, aerial drones, illicit or hazardous materials, hand irons, water heaters and candles. Passengers are allowed to bring aboard two (2) bottles of wine or champagne (750ml) per cabin for their enjoyment onboard for a 7-day Cruise or three (3) bottles for an 8-day (or longer) Cruise. Passengers may consume these permitted outside beverages in public areas on the Ship, but a small corkage fee (approximately US\$15 + 15% gratuity) will be applied to the passenger's onboard account. All additional outside alcohol (meaning wine, beer and/or hard alcohol) including alcohol purchased at ports of call along the Cruise route, will be kept by the Ship's purser and delivered to the passenger's cabin the last evening of the Cruise. We will carry as baggage only your personal effects consisting of wearing apparel, toilet articles and similar items for your wearing, comfort or convenience during the Cruise and not belonging to or intended for use by any other person or for sale. For loading and unloading the Ship and other means of transportation, all baggage must be tendered for carriage in securely constructed and locked suitcases or trunks. All baggage must be able to be safely stowed in your cabin on the Ship. The only animals permitted to accompany you are recognized service dogs for passengers with disabilities; you are responsible for complying with governmental health, documentation and other requirements as to recognized service dogs.

We do not accept to carry as baggage or assume any liability for any loss of or damage to or delay of trade goods, household goods or furniture, perishable Windstar is not obliged to provide any assistance or meet special requests items, medicine, liquor, cash, credit or debit cards, jewelry, gems, gold, silver, unless it has agreed to do so in writing. If a guest cannot be carried safely and precious metals, art, collectibles or similar valuables, securities, financial in accordance with applicable safety requirements then Windstar can refuse to instruments, records or other valuable or business documents, computers, accept the guest or embarkation of a disabled person or person with reduced cellular telephones, cameras, hearing aids, electric wheelchairs, scooters, or mobility on the grounds of safety. For these reasons, we require that if you have other video or electronic equipment, binoculars, film, videotape, computer any special medical or physical or other requirements, these be brought to our disks, audio disks, tapes, DVDs or CDs, or other articles specified in 46 U.S. attention immediately and, where possible, before booking the Cruise. Any Code Section 30503. These items should not be left unattended about the prospective passenger with disabilities or special needs must complete a special Ship or your cabin, nor should they be left unattended on other vessels, railcars, request form at *https://bit.ly/2YGmPvy*. taxis or other vehicles or in hotels, nor placed in luggage other than a bag that you carry with you. In addition, we do not assume any liability for any loss of or damage to carry-on baggage on the Ship or on the other means of

transportation or in hotels. The Ship and certain hotels may be equipped with cabin or room safes or safe-deposit boxes in the Ship's or hotel's Front Office; using these facilities will not, however, increase our liability as provided in the Passage Contract.

NON-WINDSTAR CRUISES SERVICES; ITINERARY CHANGES: These include non-Windstar Cruises Services such as airlines and other off-ship transportation carriers, shore excursions (other than the limited number of shore excursions operated by Windstar), and accommodations. Non-Windstar Cruises Services are solely at your risk and subject to the terms or arrangements made by you. Windstar Cruises assumes no responsibility with respect to these non-Windstar Cruises Services including delay, injury, death or damage to property. Situations may arise that, in the opinion of Windstar Cruises, make it necessary for Windstar Cruises to cancel, advance, or postpone a scheduled departure, change itineraries or make substitutions involving ports of call, other travel components, vessels, or other modes of transportation. These situations may include, by way of example, concerns regarding weather conditions, issues involving safety matters, alternative business arrangements or charters resulting in the decision to withdraw a Cruise from public sale, or requirements of governmental authorities. If this should occur, Windstar Cruises does not assume responsibility or liability for any losses, inconvenience, or expenses incurred by guests as a result. Please see the Windstar Cruises Passage Contract for further details.

PASSENGER CONDITION & PASSENGERS WITH DISABILITIES: There are risks inherent to being aboard a Ship. These include, by way of example, having to evacuate the Ship in case of emergency, having to move about on the Ship during rough seas and lack of access to full medical services. For people who are pregnant, ill or who are mentally or physically disabled or impaired, these risks are more significant. For example: access to all parts of the Ship, other means of transportation or to facilities on shore may be difficult or impossible for some passengers. In addition, medical evacuation during the Cruise, whether at sea, by tender, or by deviating from the scheduled itinerary, may create an increased risk of harm and may not be feasible for a variety of reasons. We reserve the right to determine, in our sole discretion exercised in good faith, whether and when a medical evacuation from the Ship will occur. For safety reasons, passengers may not book or embark upon a Cruise if the passenger may reach or exceed the 24th week of pregnancy during the Cruise.

Guests who need assistance and/or have special requests, or need special facilities or equipment with regard to accommodation, seating or services required or their need to bring medical and mobility equipment, must notify Windstar immediately and where possible before concluding their booking. This is to ensure that everyone can be carried safely and in accordance with all applicable safety requirements and to ensure that Windstar can provide the necessary assistance and there are no issues relating to the design of the Ship or port infra-structure and equipment – including port terminals – which may make it impossible to carry out the embarkation, disembarkation or carriage of guests in a safe or operationally feasible manner.

GENERAL CRUISE TERMS & CONDITIONS continued

You may be asked questions in order to ensure your safety. In limited situations where you would be unable to satisfy certain specified safety and other criteria, even when provided with appropriate auxiliary aids and services, we reserve the right to refuse permission to participate in all or part of the Cruise.

There are no elevators on Wind Star and Wind Spirit nor were these Yachts originally constructed to be wheelchair accessible and do not have accessible cabins. As a result, these two Yachts may be unsuitable for people relying solely on mobility devices. Wind Surf, Star Pride, Star Legend, and Star Breeze are equipped with elevators, although some of the passenger common areas are not wheelchair accessible. Staterooms on Wind Surf are not wheelchair accessible. Four (4) suites on the all-suite Yachts (Star Breeze, Star Legend and Star Pride) provide limited access for wheelchairs. These cabins have a smaller Queen bed and there is reduced "wheel around" space in those cabins. Also note, there is no elevator access to board any of the Ships. Certain ports require the Ships to anchor; in this case guests must be ferried into port requiring guests to board a tender boat or rubber inflatable raft ("RIB") from the Ships while at sea. A list of ports where tenders or RIBs are used is available at *http://bit.ly/2IGrGWd*. This list is not exhaustive.

Those passengers confined to wheelchairs must furnish their own slim or low profile size wheelchairs which are less than 27 inches wide. The Ships' wheelchairs are available for emergency use only. Larger, wider or motorized wheelchairs or scooters are generally too large to be accommodated on the Ships. Wheelchairs may be difficult to accommodate in embarkation and disembarkation in certain ports and in tenders. The decision of the officer in charge of tender operations as to whether wheelchairs can be accommodated is final. For reasons of health and safety the crew are forbidden from carrying passengers or passengers in wheelchairs. Wheelchairs cannot be transported in RIBs. In limited situations where an individual with a disability would be unable to satisfy certain specified safety and other criteria, even when provided with appropriate auxiliary aids and services, we may find it necessary to ask the individual to make alternative travel arrangements.

Guests must be physically and emotionally fit to travel at the time of embarkation and certify that they have no medical or emotional condition that would endanger any other passengers. Windstar recommends that any guest who is not self-sufficient travel with a companion who shall take responsibility for any assistance needed during the Cruise and in case of emergency.

Windstar reserves the right to require any passenger to produce medical evidence of fitness to travel in order to assess whether that passenger can be carried safely in accordance with applicable international, US, or Canadian law.

Windstar reserves the right to refuse passage to anyone who has failed to notify it of their specific needs with regard to accommodation, seating or services required from Windstar or terminal operators, or their need to bring medical equipment, or to bring a recognized service dog on board the Ship, or of any other known disabilities, or who in Windstar's and/or the Master's opinion is unfit or unable to travel, or anyone whose condition may constitute a danger to themselves or others onboard on the grounds of safety.

Animals and/or pets other than recognized service dogs are not allowed on board the Ship under any circumstances without Windstar's permission in writing. Recognized service dogs are permitted on board the Ship if prior arrangements have been made at the time of booking. Companion animals and emotional support animals are not allowed on board the Ship. Any such animals or pets brought on board without permission will be taken into custody and arrangements will be made for the animal to be landed at the next port of call at the passenger's sole expense.

Recognized service dogs are subject to and must comply with national, international and EU Regulations regarding health, inoculations, training and travel. It is the passenger's responsibility to have all necessary papers and clearances prior to the Cruise and to be satisfied that the service dog can be carried to the ports of embarkation and disembarkation and that the service dog is not prohibited from going ashore at the various ports of call.

Each Cruise fare includes a Non-Discountable Amount. That portion of the fare is both non-commissionable to travel professionals and not subject to reduction in the event of a percentage discount promotion, 2-for-1 promotion, or otherwise. If cost factors dictate the need for fare increases, Windstar Cruises may do so at any time prior to departure. Guests can cancel (without paying a cancellation fee) rather than accept a fare increase. Suggested onboard gratuities are extra.

Taxes, Fees & Port Expenses, as used by us, may include, without limitation, all or a portion of all fees, charges, tolls and taxes imposed on us by governmental or quasi-governmental authorities, as well as third party fees and charges arising from a vessel's presence in a harbor or port. Taxes, Fees & Port Expenses may include U.S. Customs fees, head taxes, Panama Canal or other canal tolls. passenger facilities charges, dockage fees, wharfage fees, inspection fees, pilotage, air taxes, hotel or VAT taxes incurred as part of a land tour, immigration and naturalization fees, and Internal Revenue Service fees, as well as fees for navigation, berthing, stevedoring, baggage handling/storage and security services. Taxes, Fees & Port Expenses may be assessed per passenger, per berth, per ton or per vessel. Assessments calculated on a per ton or per vessel basis will be spread over the number of passengers on the Ship. Taxes, Fees & Port Expenses are subject to change (but will not change after assessment due to currency fluctuations) and we reserve the right to collect any increases in effect at the time of sailing even if the fare has already been paid in full. Windstar Cruises reserves the right to impose or pass through fuel surcharges, security surcharges, or similar incidental surcharges. No right of cancellation exists under these circumstances.

YACHTS OWNERSHIP AND REGISTRY: All Windstar Cruises Yachts are registered in the Bahamas and owned by Windstar Cruises Marshall Islands, LLC. Yacht ownership and registry are subject to change.

TRANSFERS/PRE- & POST-CRUISE SERVICES: Services for Windstar Cruises cruise-only guests (individuals who do not purchase air transportation or cruise extensions from Windstar Cruises) begin with embarkation at the noted time in your Cruise documents. Any transfers, meals, and dayroom accommodations required prior to this time are the responsibility of the guest. Please make a note of this, as many international flights arrive several hours prior to the scheduled embarkation time. Guests may purchase a transfer from local airport to yacht for day of cruising and from yacht to local airport for day of disembarkation directly through Windstar Cruises Vacation Planning. Guests flying on dates other than the date of (dis)embarkation must arrange their own transfers unless the reason for the different date is because of the purchase of a cruise extension from Windstar Cruises. Transfers for these guests will be arranged between airport, hotel, and pier, as appropriate, so long as the transfer dates coincide with the dates of the services purchased from Windstar Cruises.
